We would like to celebrate Libraries Week 2021 by promoting all the services and resources we have to offer from North West Anglia NHS Foundation Trust Library Service based at the Laxton Library, Peterborough City Hospital and the Education Centre Library, Hinchingsbrooke Hospital.

#### *Literature Searching Service:*

We can find the evidence for you. If you are looking for information on a specific topic, want to improve patient care, service delivery, treatments and make evidence based decisions or if you are developing new guidelines or policies, the Library staff can undertake literature searches on your behalf. We search using databases such as Medline, BNI, CINAHL, AMED and The Cochrane Library etc. Please contact the Library if you would like us to perform literature searches for you or your teams.

**Training:** We also provide training in searching for evidence using the healthcare databases, the Cochrane Library and other resources etc and also training in critically appraising research articles. Health Education England has enabled online access to even more Oxford Handbooks and Textbooks, over 130 titles covering a wide range of specialties.

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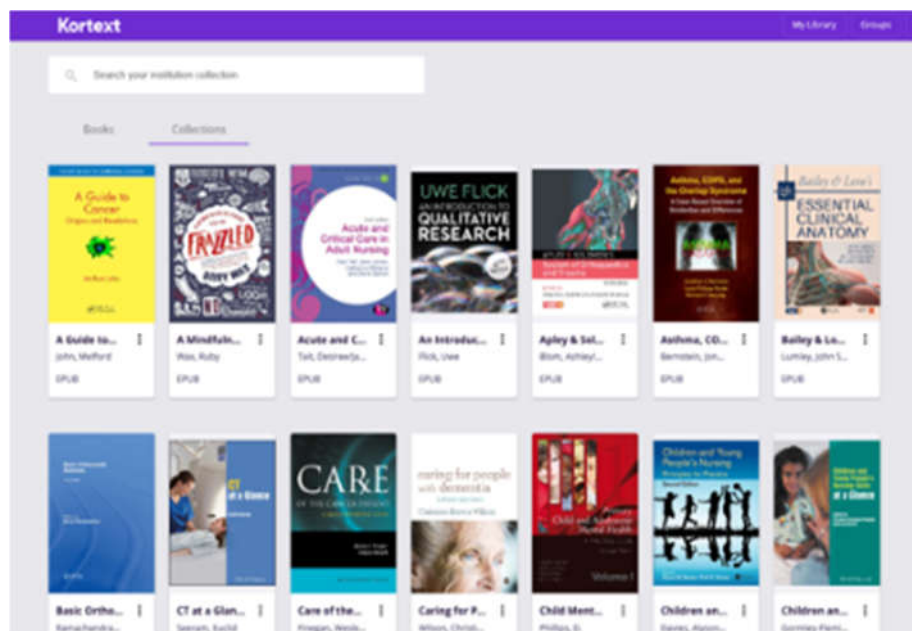

The Library has now got access to **141** online books via KORTEXT.

To access these books, go to: <https://read.kortext.com/>



- Type or select the name of your Trust from Sign in to browse your institution library (North West Anglia NHS Foundation Trust)
- Click the purple arrow on the right of the Sign in /browse institution box when your Trust is selected
- Input your OpenAthens\* login
- Look at book collections to see list of book covers
- You can click on a book and browse the content using the browse function on the left hand side.

ClinicalKey

The Library has a subscription to **ClinicalKey**, providing access to 630 e-journals and over 1,000 e-books within the Elsevier collections. It includes many of the core medical training textbooks. It also includes patient information leaflets, drug information and MEDLINE citations and abstracts and has a 'Presentation Maker', to create presentations using the many images available. 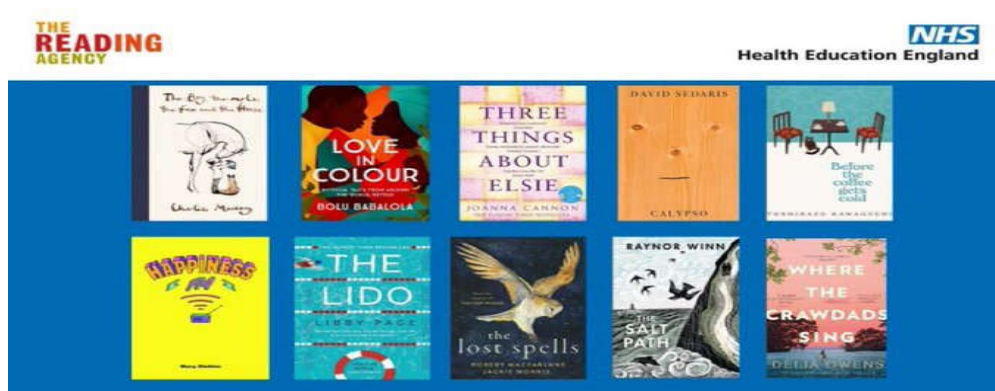


## We would also like to promote our “Reading Well Mood Boosting Books”



The Library also has a collection of The Reading Agency’s “Mood Boosting Books”. The scheme is a national promotion of uplifting titles, including novels, poetry and non-fiction. These books are available for loan at both HH and PCH. All staff are eligible to join the Library and borrow books.
